The Ulster Project is a 501 (c) 3 organization that each summer brings teens, accompanied with counselors, from Belfast, Northern Ireland. Arlington families host these 32 teens and 4 counselors during the month of July, as they participate in: community service projects, (a total of 5); attend worship services, (2 ecumenical, one Catholic Mass and one Protestant service); attend Encounter Sessions where serious issues in Northern Ireland are discussed, and then the teens enjoy a 3 day trip to San Antonio and a day at Six Flags of Arlington.

Ulster focuses on giving the teens a safe environment for learning the "how tos" of building relationships and an opportunity to experience a different cultural setting from that of back home. Once their month is complete, the teens are able to return to Ireland with a new attitude of tolerance, understanding, friendship and respect for each other's differences.

Ulster's goal is to break the cycle of prejudice and work towards creating a lasting peace. There are 25 cities in the USA that sponsor a Project. Arlington is the only one in Texas.
